School Hours

8:50 a.m. Students may enter the building. Not student may enter before 8:50 unless they are here for breakfast.

9:00 a.m. Instructional day begins. Any child coming in late **MUST** report to the main office with his or her parent to obtain a late pass. **Children will not be admitted into class without a late pass.**

3:10 – 3:15 p.m. Student dismissal

*****Please note:** In order to be admitted to the building before 8:50 students must be registered for the B.A.S.E. program. Any student, not registered in the BASE program, arriving before 8:50 a.m. will remain outside and unsupervised, as we are not able to provide supervision at this time. If your child walks to school, please time his/her travel time to school appropriately.



Dress Code

Our ultimate goal is for our children to be healthy, happy, and successful, both now and in the future. To that end, we want our students to **“Dress for success.”** At Ohio Elementary, this means that we are dressing *with respect and safety* in mind. We ask that students wear sneakers or shoes that are safe and secure on their feet, (no hee-ies or flip-flops) and clothing that is respectful to self and others. This means that we would like to see clothing that **does not** expose underwear or tummies. Please also be certain that any picture or phrases that might be displayed on clothing are appropriate for an elementary school setting.

Attention Parents: Arrival and Dismissal Policies

As we are committed to keeping your child safe at all times, the following policies have been established and we need your help with the following procedures to ensure the safety of all of our children.

Entering the Building: As the Ohio Elementary entry doors are locked between 9:15 and 2:45, should you need to enter the building during these hours please:

- Approach the main doors at the Ohio Street Entrance
- Press the doorbell to notify the office of your arrival
- The Office staff will electronically unlock the doors so you can enter
- Please proceed to the main office (to your right as you enter) to either get a visitor's pass or wait for your son/daughter or specific building personnel.

Early Dismissal: In the event that your child needs to be released during the school day, written permission must be provided. Parents must then come to the main office in order to sign out their child.

Everyday Dismissal: If your child is a bus student, written permission is required for students to be dismissed without taking the bus. We cannot allow any exceptions. If we do not have a note indicating a change in your plans, your child will be placed on the bus.

Emergency Contact Information



As you fill out the student information sheet/cards, we are requesting updated contact information, including emergency contact information. This information is critical to our ability to contact you for a variety of reasons ~ sudden school closings, student illness, and sometimes – missing permission for field trip attendance! This information also includes the identification of adults to whom you have given permission to pick up your child from school in the event of an emergency, illness, or injury. You may want to select a relative, friend, or neighbor, to whom we can release your child if you are not available. PLEASE NOTE: We will *not* be able to release your child for an unauthorized dismissal without this expressed permission for release. Please make sure that emergency contacts are available for timely pick up in the event of an emergency or illness. This is important due to the new H1N1 protocols from the NYS Health Department.

It is also important to contact the school immediately if there is ever a change in your contact information – including cell, home, or work telephone numbers and/or your home address.

Attention Parents and Visitors: Instructional Time

Remembering that our charge is your child's education, we would like to remind everyone that instructional time is very precious to everyone in school – and directly linked to the success your child experiences in school. Interruptions to instructional time, therefore, must be kept to a minimum.

As a result, we ask that you please understand and honor the following policies:

1. Limit birthday treats to the number of students within your child's classroom.
2. Visitors must report to the office upon arrival to sign the visitor's log. **NO VISITOR MAY REPORT DIRECTLY TO A CLASSROOM.** All parents, including parents of BOCES students, should use the main entrance on Ohio Street. Once you have signed in, you will receive a visitor's tag to wear during your visit.




Birthday Invitations and Treats

Please remember that Ohio Elementary is a community where we try to teach our children empathy ~ awareness of everyone's feelings. With this in mind, we prefer that private birthday invitations be distributed outside of the school day, so that we are not hurting the feelings of classmates who may not be invited.

Also, as we believe that it is important to balance the individual celebrations of special days with our goals for providing excellence in education, we ask that you please limit any birthday treats your child may bring to school to the number of people within the classroom. If your child insists that he or she would like to deliver treats to others within the building, the treat sharing will be limited to *one* other location within the building – perhaps last year's teacher, the nurse, or the main office.

B.A.S.E. (Before and After School Enrichment)

The BASE program is offered at Ohio Elementary School from 7:00 to 8:50 a.m. and from dismissal until 6:00 p.m. Applications are available in the school office.

Children who are registered for BASE must bring a note to school, stating which days they will be attending. If there is a change in days, or your child is not attending BASE on a particular day, a note must be sent to school to advise of us any changes. If we do not receive a note, we will assume your child should report to the BASE program each day. For more information, please call the BASE office at 807-3784. BASE services begin on the first day of school!

The BASE program in the North Tonawanda City Schools is governed by New York State regulations. As such, each site is audited a number of times throughout the year. Our regulations clearly state that all participants must be registered with the program in order to attend. Therefore, we are not able to accommodate any child who is not enrolled by application and registration for attendance at BASE. This includes students who miss the bus and/or late parent pick-ups.

From the School Nurse

Welcome back to all students. Listed below are a few reminders on requirements for the coming year.



1. Please let the school nurse know if your child has had any significant health problems during the summer.
2. When your child is absent from school, you must **WRITE A NOTE** stating the reason for your child's absence. If a note is not received, this will be considered an unexcused or illegal absence, and will be recorded as such on his/her permanent record.
Specific reasons must be given for any absence, tardiness, and/or early dismissal. Notes that say, "Please dismiss my child at such and such a time" are not acceptable and will be recorded as unexcused/illegal.
3. If your child will require **MEDICATION** in school, the school nurse must have a written prescription from the doctor. Included must be the diagnosis, name of the drug, amount and time to be given to the student. An adult must bring medication to school. Do not send medication to school with your child. It may be an adult other than a parent, but *an adult must deliver medication.*
4. Students in kindergarten, 2nd, and 4th grades, as well as some special education students and students new to the district are required to have a physical. The district doctor will be at Ohio during the school year, (after October 1); to give physicals to students whose parents have not provided the school with a signed physical form from their own doctor. If you need a copy of the district form, please call the school nurse at 807-3800 and one will be sent home with your son/daughter. (We do not accept forms from the doctor's office.) The district forms need to be returned to school by October 1st.
5. The school nurse will be in her office daily from 8:15 – 3:30. If your child will be absent or late, please call the school nurse to let her know. If you do not call, the school nurse is required to contact parents in order to find out why the child is absent. A voice mail is available if you need to call before 8:15 or if she is away from her desk. Please remember, the school nurse's first responsibility is to provide first aid and emergency care. She is not permitted to diagnose illness or give treatment for old injuries. If you have any questions, please contact the school nurse at 807-3800.

Telephone and Cell Phone Use



Telephone use, by the student, during the school day is discouraged. Students should work with their parents to plan ahead to include homework, field trip permission slips, physical education and musical education equipment, within their preparation for each school day in order to build responsibility and organization skills.

Additionally, while students within our schools may possess mobile and digital technology, including but not limited to personal or family cell phones, possession of these items are subject to the following rules:

1. *No use of mobile or digital devices is permitted on school grounds.*
2. Students possessing these devices may NOT turn these devices on while on school grounds until the end of the official instructional day, unless during an emergency situation AND with adult permission to do so.
3. The school and/or school district is NOT responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged equipment.
4. *Should a cell phone or other device be seen or heard during the school day, these possessions may, in part or in whole, be removed by the teacher or adult in charge and held until parent pick-up can be arranged.*

SEX OFFENDER NOTIFICATION

The North Tonawanda Police Department has informed the school district that we will no longer be receiving written notification of level 2 and 3 sex offenders through the mail as we have in the past. The Niagara County Sheriff's Department created a web site listing all the level 2 and 3 sex offenders in their jurisdiction and the NT Police Department has teamed up with them. Level 2 and 3 sex offenders residing in North Tonawanda are now on that web site.

Additionally, the web site will allow users to sign up for a notification service that will automatically notify you via e-mail every time a level 2 or 3 sex offender moves into or from place to place within Niagara County.

The state web site allows you to search by name, county, or zip code throughout New York. The state's toll free number is 1-800-262-3257.

Global Connect Program

The North Tonawanda City School District has recently implemented the Global Connect program within our district. This program is designed to enable us to complete "mass" phone calling under emergency conditions or to share district-wide information with parents. This venue for communication proved critical during recent district events and our efforts to succeed in timely communication with all parents.

In order for this program to work most effectively, we ask you to maintain current contact information with us. If any of your contact information changes, please be certain to complete and submit your emergency contact form to Ohio's main office. We will then forward the information to our district offices so that the Global Connect system can be well maintained.

It is important that you keep us informed of any changes in your contact information throughout the year...so that we can better keep you informed!

Nutrition News

There are four entrees offered daily at the Elementary Schools. You will see three on the menu and we offer Peanut Butter and Jelly Sandwiches daily. There are eight entrees offered daily at the Middle School and nine entrees offered daily at the High School. In addition to the menu items at the Secondary Schools there are other entrees available daily. They are a Main Entrée, two varieties of Pizza, Hot Sandwich, Julienne Salad, Deli Submarine, Specialty Salads, Peanut Butter & Jelly and Mexican entree. The High school has a Deli/Salad Bar daily. There is a choice of six side dishes daily at the secondary schools. The students may choose three. The students must choose an entrée and three other items to be considered a lunch. They do not have to choose milk. They may choose a total of the entrée, three side dishes and milk. Fresh fruit is available daily with breakfast and lunch.

Watch the menu for a different variety of lunches that include Veggie Sub, Bagel with Cream Cheese & Fruit, Yogurt Platter, Fun Salads, Veggie Wraps and French Bread Subs. Back by popular demand are Combo Lunches at the Elementary Schools. A little bit of a lot of favorites put together in one entrée. We have Pizza & Nugget Combo with pizza and chicken fingers together, Hodge Podge Basket with Mozzarella sticks, Chicken Fingers and a mini hot pretzel as well as our Breadstick Combo with Breadsticks Parmesan, Chicken Fingers and Smile Fries. Each lunch has dipping sauce available.

Remember to fill out the application for the free or reduced lunch. Even if you think that you won't qualify, you may be surprised. Applications must be turned in by 9/30/08 to continue to receive a free or reduced meal.
