


Learning and Achievement

- School-Based Goal #1: Student performance levels will increase as follows:
 - Passing rates on all regents exams will be 90 percent or higher
 - Mastery rates will meet or exceed 2006-2007 levels
 - At least 95 percent of graduates will earn a Regents diploma, and at least 75 percent will earn the Regents with Advanced Designation

Learning and Achievement (Performance Levels) Select Dept. Goals

- Guidance Dept: Continue to track student and cohort progress toward graduation, and identify needed support services.
- English Dept: Change/Improve method of statistical comparison for Passing and Mastery rates; Track/Compare Class of '08, '09, 10 through Grades 9, 10, 11

• Science Dept:

- Conduct item analysis of June Regents Exams. Use data to revise curriculum maps to re-evaluate lesson plans.
- Develop continuity between sub-departments regarding student lab eligibility for final exams based on the N.Y.S. mandate.
- Increase by 3% the 3-year passing and mastery rates for Regents
 Exams

Learning and Achievement (Performance Levels) Select Dept. Goals

- Social Studies Dept: Raise the Global History Regents exam passing rate by 2% from 83% to 85% and mastery rates from 24% to 26%.
- Foreign Languages Dept: Maintain/increase Mastery Rates.
 Department will develop a procedure for the creation of student journals.
- Administration-Drop/Add Policy Committee: Develop revisions to existing drop/add policy in the interest of encouraging more students to commit to higher level courses that support attainment of the Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation.

Learning and Achievement (Enhancement) Select Department Goals

- English Dept: Share "Best Practice" lessons, projects, evaluations to aid professional development of department members and provide a wider range of materials to address the varied student learning styles and levels of ability present in heterogeneous classrooms.
- Math Dept: To promote academic rigor in our department by keeping students enrolled in courses that align with their academic abilities.
- **Music Dept:** To increase student participation in NYSSMA events (All County, All State) by 10% and increase/motivate student participation in ensembles by 20% through their senior year.

Learning and Achievement (Enhancement) Select Department Goals

Business Dept:

- Increase the number of articulation agreements with area colleges.
- Increase the number of students taking MOS exams for college credit.

Technology Dept:

- Collaborate with other departments in relevant subjects.
- Students will be provided the opportunities to be challenged in different facets of the math, science and technology fields and learn more about occupational prospects.
- Physical Education Dept: Enhance learning and provide academic support for students with individual differences.
